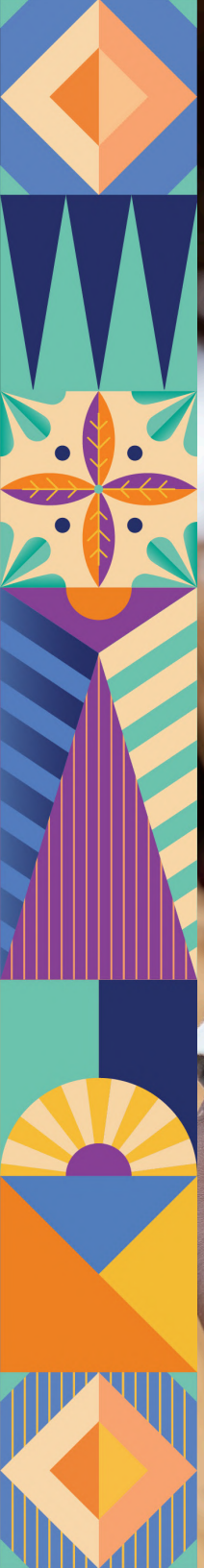

In 2022, Yamba Malawi's comprehensive, community-led initiatives impacted the lives of over 55,000 children by tackling the root causes of poverty. The transformation is unmistakable - twice as many young children now consume sufficient, nutritious food daily, and there's been a significant 71% reduction in households living below the poverty line.

Our model has proven successful and is transforming children's lives in Malawi, addressing the issues of multidimensional poverty. To bring hope and opportunity to every child in need, we must continue to raise awareness, form strategic partnerships, and work hand-in-hand with governments to scale our program, and our impact.

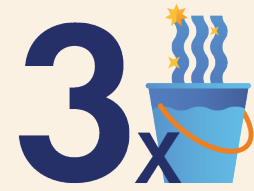
2022 IMPACT DATA

In 2022, Yamba Malawi realized the following impacts:

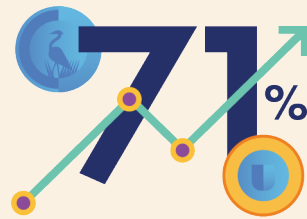
**IMPROVING WELLBEING
AND FUTURES FOR CHILDREN**



2 times increase in the number of young children eating sufficient, nutritious food daily.



3 times decrease in the cases of waterborne disease due to improvements in household water and sanitation practices.



71% reduction in the percentage of households subsisting below the poverty line, defined as \$1.90 per day.



3 times increase in households with access to financial services, primarily facilitated by community banks (Village Savings & Loans groups).



98% of young children are regularly attending preschool.



HOW IT WORKS

Our three-year program meaningfully and sustainably improves the lives of children.

To achieve this, we support parents and caregivers in the following ways:



CHILDHOOD WELLBEING

Parental coaching and linkages to essential childcare services



ENTREPRENEURSHIP

Training and capital to launch and run sustainable businesses



FINANCIAL LITERACY

Access to community banks and savings to build for the future

When parents and caregivers have sustainable and dependable income sources—and understand what children need to thrive—they can confidently invest in their children's futures, providing nutritious meals, consistent schooling, safe homes, vital healthcare services and other opportunities.

TOGETHER, WE CAN END CHILDHOOD POVERTY.

THE KALEBE FAMILY

Meet Austin (3 years old), Aubrey (7 years old), and Often (10 years old), who live in the Khongoni community with their loving mother, Annette Kalebe, and their grandmother, who resides next door.

Before joining Yamba Malawi, Annette and her husband faced immense challenges in providing nutritious food for their children. They sold crops and donuts to make ends meet, but the children ate only once a day and lacked warm blankets for a good night's sleep. As the program began, Annette tragically lost her husband, but found renewed determination to build a better life for Austin, Aubrey, and Often.

TODAY HER CHILDREN ARE FLOURISHING!

With the monthly support from Yamba Malawi, Annette ensures her children receive three nutritious meals a day. She has invested in her agricultural business, cultivating maize, soybeans, and groundnuts. The profits she earns are devoted to her children's wellbeing, and she wisely budgets and plans for their future.

Annette proudly shares, "My life has changed. I am an independent woman. I feel like I have made progress, and even without my husband, I can properly take care of my children. That is something I am truly proud of."





TISUNGE TEBULO

Desire (2 years old) and Julita (7 years old) are the children of Tisunge and Frederick Tebulo, and live in the Mtonda community of Mangochi, Malawi. Prior to joining Yamba Malawi, Tisunge did not have a regular job with an income. Tisunge joined Yamba Malawi with the hope that the knowledge she gained would uplift the lives of her children and husband.

As in all our partner communities, financial literacy is a crucial program component. It empowers families to save, plan for the future, and manage their businesses sustainably. Each program participant joins a community bank, where they can save and borrow money for business investments, home improvements, or school fees.

With support from Yamba Malawi, Tisunge, now the secretary of her community bank, received training and one-on-one coaching about the importance of saving so that she can plan for the future, anticipate investment needs for her business, and weather potential shocks. She attends meetings regularly and is enthusiastic about the potential growth of her business and the implementation of her business plan, where she sells smoked fish and tomatoes.

Now, Tisunge can better take care of Julita and Desire. As she is paying for their school fees and school materials, she is also actively planning for the future and expanding her enterprise to better meet her children's needs now and tomorrow.

ZAINABU RAJABU'S STORY



Razida (5 years old) and twins Ashraff and Shariff (12 years old) are the children of Zainabu Rajabu, married to Cassim. The Rajabus live in Mangochi, Malawi.

Before joining Yamba Malawi, Zainabu struggled to provide for her children. They lacked a diverse diet and were not eating three meals a day.

SHE IS COMMITTED TO HER CHILDREN'S NUTRITION.

With Yamba Malawi's support, Zainabu has started a sweet potato business, joined a community bank as an active member, and intends to expand her business further.

To guarantee her children receive a balanced diet from all essential food groups, Zainabu has established a kitchen garden with vegetables, planted a fruit tree, and is raising livestock, including chickens and goats. She sells the surplus vegetables from her garden for additional income. With access to nutritious food, her children are now thriving.

ADVOCATING FOR CHILDREN'S AND WOMEN'S RIGHTS

We have participated in national leadership events and dialogues throughout the year to champion children's and women's rights, recognizing their interconnected nature. We've engaged in International Women's Day, Rural Women's Day, Early Childhood Development Week, and Ending Violence Against Women initiatives, focusing on the unique needs of the communities we serve.

LAUNCHING A GROUNDBREAKING RESEARCH AGENDA

In collaboration with Brown University and Kenya-based Busara Center for Behavioral Economics, we've designed a pioneering research study on our program effectiveness, set to launch in 2023. The insights gained will allow our model to be replicated throughout Malawi and globally, impacting exponentially more children and families through poverty eradication programs.





EMBRACING OUR COMMITMENT TO DECOLONIZATION

To embody our core value of Umodzi (equity & diversity), we have continued to decolonize development and cultivate local leadership through expanded learning and action involving staff, program participants, our boards of directors, and partners.

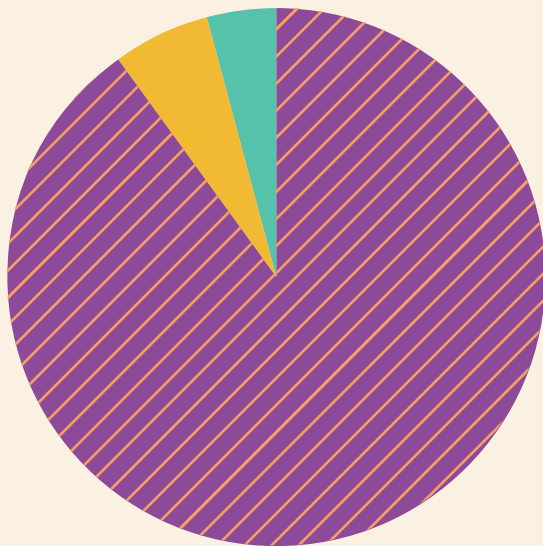
CELEBRATING OUR ACHIEVEMENTS IN 2022
